Principal's Corner

There has been some discussion regarding the grade 5/6 camp. Ideally all grades would attend together. However, as we now have 7 grades this is not possible. The 7 grades will be split into either Group 1 or Group 2, each of the groups will attend on different dates. (4 in one group & 3 in the other.) The aim of the camp is for the students and the teacher to form a positive working culture and relationship between all members of the grade. This can't be achieved if the camp split into 5s and 6s nor if the teachers only go on camp with half of their grade. Each class will also do follow up with their teacher.

Tomorrow our 2017 Student Leadership Group will be attending the GRIP Conference.

The GRIP Student Leadership Conference is unique in that it concentrates specifically on training student leaders for their role as school leaders. The style, topics, and content of this conference all focus on what the students can do RIGHT NOW. The goal is for student leaders to leave the conference with a clear vision, a solid understanding and dozens of ideas for their time as a leader. Ms McKendrick works on developing our leaders on a regular basis. Ms McKendrick and Mr Jenkins will attend the conference with our leaders.

Hand foot and mouth disease - coxsackie virus

Hand foot and mouth disease (HFMD) is a viral infection. It is not linked to the foot and mouth disease that affect animals. HFMD is mainly seen in children under the age of 10 or in young adults. It is easily spread from one person to another. Most people have had HFMD by the time they are adults. It rarely causes further complications and is very rarely fatal.

Signs and symptoms

Symptoms usually start three to seven days after catching the infection and can last from seven to 10 days. Admission to hospital is rarely needed. The common signs and symptoms include:

- high temperature (fever)
- sore throat
- small blisters on the inside of the mouth, the sides of the tongue, palms of the hands, fingers, soles of the feet and nappy area (the blisters should not be itchy like chickenpox blisters)
- poor appetite (drinking and eating can be painful because of the mouth blisters)
- tiredness.

How is it spread?

The main way HFMD is spread is by touching the fluid from inside the blisters or fluids from the nose, mouth and chest spread from sneezing and coughing. It can also be in bowel movements (poo) for up to several weeks after a person has been infected.

How to stop it spreading

- Washing hands after touching these bodily fluids is the best way to prevent the spread of HFMD.
- Not sharing items such as cutlery, drinking cups, towels, toothbrushes and clothing will help to reduce the spread to others.
- Your child should stay home from school, crèche, playgroup, kindergarten or child care until all the fluid in the blisters has dried.

Causes

Hand foot and mouth disease is caused by a group of viruses known as enteroviruses. It is most commonly caused by the coxsackie virus A 16, with the virus EV 71 being less common.

Treatment

- There is no treatment for HFMD. Because it is a virus, antibiotics will not work to treat it.
- Give pain relief for mouth blisters. Ask your pharmacist or family doctor about what medicines are good to use.
- Give your child frequent sips of drinks. This will stop them from becoming dehydrated.
- Leave blisters to dry naturally. Do not pierce or squeeze them.
- If your child gets a headache, stiff neck or back pain seek medical advice immediately from your family doctor or nearest hospital emergency department.

SCHOOL EXCLUSION:

The DEET requires students with this virus to be excluded until all blisters have dried up.

There is no exclusion of contacts. (other people)

Dear Families,

Re: Bendigo School Banking

This letter is to advise you that school banking will be ceasing at Altona Primary School from 20/2/17.

This is occurring for a number of reasons;

- 1/ Changes to legislation have meant that families have to directly attend banks when opening accounts to produce 100 points so 'joining' via school is no longer an option.
- 2/ Families often choose to open accounts for children via their own banking institutions, rather than Bendigo Bank leading to a reduction in children using the school system. At times children have then brought in bank books for varying banking institutions and they have had their books returned without money being deposited.
- 3/ Due to a reduction in parent volunteers over the years, the Friends and Family Committee are no longer able to regularly commit to delivering and collecting the bank books.

We hope that school banking has been a positive learning experience for your child and that it has set them on a good path for future adult saving.

DID YOU KNOW? Australia has the highest incidence of melanoma in the world for both males and females. Two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the age of 70. In Victoria, more than 40,000 new cases of skin cancer are diagnosed annually.

DID YOU KNOW? Too much UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer. Overexposure to UV during childhood and adolescence is a major factor for future skin cancer risk.

DID YOU KNOW? You can't see or feel the sun's UV so don't be fooled. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to

Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide!


Encourage everyone in your family to be Sunsmart by following these 5 steps:




1. Slip on a shirt - ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.



2. Slop on SPF 30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen – apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and make sure children have sunscreen in their bag ready to be reapplied throughout the day. Sunscreen should be reapplied regularly. Please ensure they get plenty of sunscreen application practice at home so they'll be all set when they are at school.

3.  **Slap on a hat** – one that protects the face, neck and ears such as a broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat. Peak caps do not offer enough protection and are not recommended by SunSmart. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved school hat.

4.  **Seek shade** – choose shady spots for play whenever possible. There are lots in our school.

5.  **Slide on some sunglasses** – wear glasses that cover as much of the eye area as possible.

At Altona Primary School we create an environment that promotes the Sunsmart principles by regularly reinforcing and modelling Sunsmart behaviours. Please read the Altona Primary School “Sun & UV Protection Policy” which is located on the school website.

As part of the implementation of this policy, a few key points to help you:

- parents are responsible for supplying sunscreen which can be kept in student’s bags
- parents are requested to show students how to apply sunscreen
- students are responsible for applying their own sunscreen
- teachers will encourage students to be responsible for their own sun protection by reminding students to apply their own sunscreen, wear a hat, seek shade, wear appropriate clothing including a school approved hat and sunglasses if chosen
- *students who do not wear a hat will be required to play in the Rotunda near the spider playground*

Other Clean Up Australia Day events will be held around Hobson's Bay on Sunday 5th March.

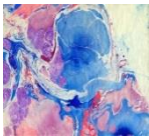
